

Our Pre-K curriculum begins with following routines, learning how to listen to directions, becoming comfortable in school, and socializing with peers. From then on, our curriculum is learning a new letter of the alphabet each week along with a number. For example, we focus on the letter “N” and the number 9 for one week. Throughout the year, we are learning sight words or “high” frequency words. Students will be given two words each week to practice. By the end of the year, they will have a mini notebook filled with words that they will know how to read. As the year comes to an end, we are beginning work on addition and subtraction.

Students will also be able to write their name (first and last), write various words and be able to begin reading and writing short complete sentences. Science is also laid out in the curriculum through experiments and stories as well as social studies through discussions of national holidays and historical events. Finally, religion is a core element in our classroom and students will be able to say multiple prayers and begin learning various Biblical stories. Pre-K is a fun place to be and lots of development occurs quickly in order to prepare students for Kindergarten!
